M.Sc. in Construction Management



This course is designed for engineers to be competent in the qualitative construction of necessary infrastructure for the development of the country. Due to the lack of management skills, our construction works have lacked the requisite standard, leading to the production of undesirable construction works.

This course not only focuses on the science but also on mitigating technology of earthquakes. This is done with the offer of Research Methodology, Management, construction safety, and several other such courses. It is a two-year course with 60 credits devoted to several theoretical, elective, and Project Work courses, culminating in the thesis in the last semester. For this, students will be evaluated through seminars, written examinations, and assessments.
